Election security and staff safety improvements




The vast majority of local election officials report that their offices have taken steps to increase election security since 2020



What steps, if any, has your office taken to increase election security since 2020? Please select all that appry. Among all local election officials, n = 928




Most local election officials who reported legislation and additional funding to protect election workers say the changes were helpful

Which of the following actions, if any, have you taken in the time since the 2020 election cycle? Please select all that apply.




Threats, Harassment, and Abuse

Have you ever been harassed or abused because of your job as a local election official? Have you ever been threatened because of your job as a local election official? Among all local election officials, n = 928





Pop up messages offered the following definitions:



Regardless of whether or not you have personally been threatened because of your job as a local election official, do you feel that threats against election officials have increased, decreased, or have stayed about the same since 2020?



You indicated that you have been threatened because of your job as a local election official. How have you been threatened? Please select all that apply. Among local election officials who report being threatened, n = 146






Nearly half of threats to local election officials go unreported

Among those who have been threatened, n = 146






Those who report threats typically go to local law enforcement; reports to state law enforcement have roughly doubled since 2023

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
Did you report this threat to law enforcement? Please select all that apply. Among those who reported a threat to law enforcement, n = 80 (2024), n = 52 (2023)

Among all local election officials, n = 852 (2023), n = 928 (2024)






Artificial intelligence

Are you currently using artificial intelligence in any of the following ways in your work as an election official? Please select all that apply.


Have any vendors or outside groups approached you with products that they advertise as using artificial intelligence?



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
Would it be helpful for federal, state, or local agencies to give you guidelines about using artificial intelligence in election administration?

Law Enforcement Pocket Guides

MICHIGAN 2024

This pocket reference guide contains key penal provisions found within Chapter 168 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, and other relevant sections.

- Intimidating an election official to interfere with or prevent them from performing their duties is a misdemeanor.
- Attempting to deter or interrupt a person from voting is a felony.
- Causing a disturbance at an election is a misdemeanor.
